#### **Survey Objectives**

- To continue to meet and exceed the expectations of its growing community, it is important for the City of Kamloops to regularly assess the satisfaction, needs, priorities, and attitudes of its residents.
- Therefore, the main objectives of the research were to:
  - How do people feel about living in Kamloops and what do they think the future will hold?
  - What issues are top of mind?
  - Which City services are the most important and how is the City doing in terms of providing services to residents?
  - Is the City providing effective government?
  - What are residents opinions about the level of crime and safety in the community? What are they most worried about?
  - City finances do residents prefer tax increases or service cuts?
  - What types of information are residents looking for the City to provide and how should the City provide it?
  - Plus specific issues including: referendum, UCC renaming, types of parks.





#### Methodology


- Survey conducted among residents of the City of Kamloops aged 18 and older.
- Survey fielded between October 7th 15th, 2003.
- Random sample of 400 (margin of error: ±4.9%, 19 times out of 20).
- First year the survey has been conducted via telephone.
  - This methodology helps increase the accuracy and representativeness of results.
- Overall results are weighted to reflect the relative size of the each region and to ensure the age, sex distribution reflects that of the actual Kamloops population according to the 2001 census data.
- Only statistically significant differences between North Shore and South Shore are mentioned.
- Where possible, results are compared to previous City of Kamloops surveys and Ipsos-Reid Municipal Norms.
- Non-random feedback mechanism was made available to residents.







### Definition of North Shore and South Shore Regions



For the purposes of this survey "North Shore" was defined as all areas in Kamloops that are north of the South Thompson River (excluding the Indian reserve) and "South Shore" was defined as all areas south of the river.





#### **Key Findings**

- Residents think they have a good quality of life and that their quality of life has generally improved over the last five years. This is consistent with other municipalities, and slightly more positive compared to 2001.
- Community is hopeful and positive about the future but has continuing concerns about the local economy.
- Water quality, referendum, unemployment and crime are residents' current, specific, top of mind concerns.
- Fire services and parks and trails are the City's primary strengths.
- Road maintenance and neighbourhood improvements are primary weaknesses.
- City staff and government receive good marks for their performance. Speed of response and access - especially among North Shore residents - may be areas for improvement.
- Some sense that the city is becoming less safe property crime.
- Like many other municipalities today, residents of Kamloops would rather see tax increases than service cuts.



How would you rate the overall quality of life in Kamloops today?










### And, Kamloops' quality of life shows clear positive momentum

And, do you feel that the quality of life in Kamloops in the past five years has ...?










### Economy and better municipal service top reasons for improved quality of life

Why do you think the quality of life has improved?







Why do you think the quality of life has worsened?







Significant difference.






### Meanwhile, ten year personal economic outlook is even more positive

Is that much or somewhat better/worse off?








### While still good, outlook for children is less positive than personal outlook

All things considered, do you think your children will be better off or worse off than you? Is that much or somewhat better/worse off?










### Overall Hope Index is comparable to national average - NS higher than SS



In your view, as a resident of the City of Kamloops, what is the most important issue facing your community, that is the one issue you feel should receive the greatest attention from your local leaders?










### Specifically - water quality, referendum, unemployment and policing

In your view, as a resident of the City of Kamloops, what is the most important issue facing your community, that is the one issue you feel should receive the greatest attention from your local leaders?










### Satisfaction with city services is very high - fire, parks & rec and beautification are tops

Please rate how satisfied you are with the City of Kamloops' services. Our scale is very satisfied, somewhat satisfied, not very satisfied or not at all satisfied.










### Satisfaction has remained consistent over the years - fire, roads, recycling up



### Similarly, satisfaction with recreation, parks and beautification has remained consistent










#### "Nuts and Bolts" services most important, "Social" services slightly lower

Please rate how important each one is to you. Our scale is very important, somewhat important, not very important.










### Road maintenance and neighbourhood improvements are primary weaknesses








# Widespread and strong support for renaming University College of the Cariboo

Do you support or oppose renaming the University College of the Cariboo to the University of the Cariboo? Would that be strongly or somewhat?










## Two weeks before referendum slim majority supports expanded and improved facilities








### Residents are firmly in favour of natural parks - slight change from previous years










### Half have dealt with the City and most are satisfied with the experience

Have you contacted or dealt with the City of Kamloops or one of its employees in the last twelve months?





Thinking about all the services you receive from the City of Kamloops, please tell me whether you agree or disagree with each of the following statements.








# Awareness of "Tournament Capital" branding is high

Are you aware of the City of Kamloops' initiative to brand the City as the 'Tournament Capital of Canada'?










## Net negative momentum (-13) when it comes to residents' perception of safety

Would that be a lot/somewhat more/less secure?










## Break and enter and car theft top residents crime and safety concerns

In your opinion, what is the biggest crime and safety issue currently facing Kamloops?










## Residents worry most about youth crime and break & enter - less about assault

To what extent do you worry about <item>? Would you say you worry a great deal, somewhat, a little, or do not worry at all about ...?
















## Most residents support City spending on tourism and economic development



Thinking about your information needs, what kinds of information do you want the City of Kamloops to provide you with?










## Newspaper, TV and newsletters - residents preferred methods of communication

And what methods would be best for the City to communicate this information to you?



















#### **Household Size**

How many people, including yourself, live in your household?
















#### **Household Composition**


Which of the following best describes your household? Is it...




One or more single adults sharing a residence (you by yourself or with at least one roommate)




Couple with no dependent children

Extended family (parents, grandparents and children all living together)










#### **Years Lived in Kamloops**

How many years have you lived in the City of Kamloops?

















#### **Owners vs. Renters**

Do you own or rent your current place of residence?














#### Income
