Curbside Organic Waste Collection

In August 2022, Council authorized a city-wide curbside residential organic waste collection program. The program builds upon a yearlong pilot program that tested organic waste collection in five select neighbourhoods to learn what works well and what could be improved for a community-wide program.

One of the main goals of the pilot program was to determine how much organic waste residents could keep out of the landfill. By the end of the year-long pilot program, food waste diversion rates increased significantly—44% of surveyed participants said they were able to keep ALL food waste out of their garbage (up from 6% at the



2023 Dog Licences Are Due January 1

Renewal notices have been sent out via mail and through email for owners who have registered their dog account on MyCity. Any unpaid dog licence fees on the account for 2022 or previous years have been carried over to the 2023 invoice. Any payment made after January 1 will automatically have a late payment penalty of \$32.50 applied to the account.

HOW TO PAY

- · Pay for your licence online via credit card. Visa/Mastercard, Debit, or Interac at: Kamloops.ca/PayOnline
- Pay in person at Community Services at the North Shore Community Policing Office (915 7th Street) or City Hall (7 Victoria Street West)

Residents are reminded that if a significant change in dog ownership occurs, such as rehoming or if the animal is deceased, the dog owner must contact Community Services directly to have the animal removed from the database to be withdrawn from the licence renewal process. This step is not available online.
