Kamloops is located on Tk'emlúps te Secwépemc territory, situated within the unceded ancestral lands of the Secwépemc Nation. As we face the challenges of the climate crisis together, we have opportunities to learn from traditional knowledge to better understand our local ecosystems and foster sustainable ways of living that have long been practised on these lands—Secwépemculecw.

EXPLORE climate change, local ecosystems, and Secwépemc traditional knowledge.



REFLECT on your own connections to the natural world and with the themes of the trail signs.
