KAMLOOPS COMMUNITY PATROLS

Volunteers will be a presence in neighbourhoods identified by the police serving as an extra pair of eyes and ears.

As a Community Patrol Volunteer you will:

- help keep your community safe
- aid in the location and recovery of stolen vehicles
- meet new people who share a common interest
- enhance your work experience (resume building)
- develop new skills (observation, report writing)
- learn more about crime prevention

SPEED WATCH/CELL WATCH

Volunteers work closely with the Kamloops RCMP Traffic Services Section to make a real impact on road safety.

Typical duties include:

- raising drivers' awareness about their real travel speed using radar equipment and speed reader boards
- providing real-time data on the reality of speeding in high complaint areas
- boosting police visibility in collision hotspots and high complaint areas
- educating drivers on distracted driving and pedestrian awareness through a variety of means

VOLUNTEER EXPECTATIONS

Volunteers interested in the Community Crime Prevention program must meet the following requirements:

- at least 19 years old
- hold a valid BC Driver's Licence
- proficient in English
- strong written English skills
- able to commit to 2-4 shifts per a month
- must have Canadian citizenship or hold a Permanent Resident Card (5 Years)



COMMUNITY CRIME PREVENTION EDUCATION

Volunteers engage with the general public in delivering crime prevention programs.

Typical duties include:

- attending community events to help police with visibility and community relations
- supporting crime prevention and public safety initiatives
- using public speaking skills to convey crime prevention information
- participating in Lock Out Auto Crime initiatives to reduce theft from motor vehicles
- participating in 529 Garage bicycle registration and information events
