

City Centre Sanitary Upgrades Project


Major work along the Lansdowne Street corridor has begun as part of the City Centre Sanitary Upgrades Project to install a trunk sewer main from 1st Avenue to 7th Avenue.

Commuters in and through the downtown core will experience significant impacts, including phased closures along Lansdowne Street until late November 2024 as crews move eastward throughout the project.

The first major detour phase will take place until late June with the closure of Lansdowne Street from 1st Avenue to 2nd Avenue. A portion of Lorne Street from Uji Way to Lansdowne Street in the area of the CP Rail Bridge is also closed.

Water Use Restrictions

The City's new Water Use Restriction Plan is in effect and applies to all customers who receive their water supply from the City's potable water system.

The new Water Use Restriction Plan will now be in effect year-round and replaces the old odd/even model that was implemented seasonally.

The normal stage of the Water Use Restriction Plan is the default water restriction stage during which lawn irrigation is permitted three days a week. This stage remains in effect unless an elevated restriction stage is declared by the City based on provincial drought levels. If the City declares an elevated restriction stage, residents will be notified accordingly and heightened restrictions will come into effect 24 hours after the elevated stage is announced on the City's website.

The final digits of your legal street address will determine your allowable water use days. For residents who reside in a complex or strata, the street address of the complex or strata will determine your appropriate watering day.

Care About Bears

Make sure your garbage and organic waste are not an easy food source.

Under Solid Waste and Recyclables Bylaw No. 40-67:

- Residents must ensure that solid waste carts are stored securely and made inaccessible to wildlife.
- Carts must not be placed at the curb earlier than 4:00 am on collection day between April 1 and November 30.
- No property owner or occupier shall accumulate, store, or collect any wildlife attractants unless stored in an enclosed structure or closed container.
