City Budget Process and Public Budget Meeting

Every fall, the City begins preparing to update its annual budget, which is the financial plan for creating and maintaining programs and services for citizens. The Public Budget Meeting in February is a key budget cycle activity. At the meeting, the public has the opportunity to provide feedback on what has been updated or deleted in the provisional budget as well as share ideas and comments on the supplemental requests.

Key Budget Cycle Activities

July-September

City departments prepare and update their budgets for the upcoming five years (e.g. 2020-2024).

November - Public Budget Meeting

The public has the opportunity to provide feedback on the provisional budget and to share ideas and opportunities for consideration in future budget cycles.



Final tax rate is set.

September-October

City managers and the Financial Planning team review budget submissions and examine the overall impact to the budget.

November-December

Council reviews and discusses the provisional budget.

On November 5, 2019, Kamloops City Council unanimously voted to support the development of the Kamloops Centre for the Arts in partnership with the KCA Society and directed staff to initiate a referendum to measure the electors' support for funding up to \$45 million of the construction cost.
