




Population Growth Projections

- 3. High growth @ 1.5% annually







Median age: 41.9


Males per Females: 0.961


Median age: 41.5

Males per Females: 0.959






Labour Force




Value of Building Permits (2006 – 2015)








Number of Residential Building Permits (2006 – 2015)

Community Vision & Values Community Vision

Based on community input into KAMPLAN, residents want Kamloops to be a **sustainable** community that supports active and **healthy** living, and is **diverse**, **inclusive** and **vibrant**.

- **Sustainable** Kamloops is an environmental leader, inspiring a culture of sustainability among residents as the City progresses towards greater ecological health, livability, economic vitality, and community resiliency.
- **Healthy** Recreational and cultural activities are plentiful, further enhance social networks, and support healthy and active lifestyles.
- **Diverse** Kamloops' economy is characterized as growing, vibrant, and diverse, supported by training and education opportunities that help retain and attract new businesses.
- **Inclusive** Housing is available and affordable to all residents through a variety of housing types to respond to changing demographics and population growth.
- **Vibrant** Neighbourhoods are safe, compact, and provide a diversity of housing choices and amenities that create vibrant places in which to live, work, and play.



Community Vision & Values Community Values

- Develop complete neighbourhoods
- Support urban densification
- Support the availability of diverse housing options
- Improve transportation and connectivity
- Invest in arts, culture, sports and recreation
- Support local food production
- Promote environmental stewardship
- Promote economic diversity
- Optimize existing municipal infrastructure
- Build regional partnerships



KAC Roles & Responsibilities Refresher

Committee Members

Advise the City through project staff on the preparation of a revised OCP by:

- Reviewing information and material prepared and presented by project staff
- Providing feedback and advice on the OCP planning process, including the public consultation plan prepared by project staff
- Reviewing and advising on the relationship between the OCP and the Sustainable Kamloops Plan and other Plans adopted since 2004
- Providing staff with advice on updating existing OCP policies and establishment of new policy areas, (i.e. policy for adaptation to and mitigation of climate change)
- Reviewing and providing advice on the organization and content of the revised OCP



KAC Roles & Responsibilities Refresher

Other functions include:

- Read/review minutes and documents sent for meetings and stay up to date with email and other correspondence
- Work collaboratively with other Committee members
- Notify the Committee chair or project planner if they cannot attend a meeting. If a member misses two consecutive meetings, they may be replaced on the Committee

In addition City Council Representatives:

- Share the minutes of KAC meetings at regular Council meetings (for information)
- Are non-voting members of the Advisory Committee

What, Why & How of Policy Development

What is Policy Development?

The activity of developing policy generally involves research, analysis, consultation and synthesis of information to produce recommendations. It should also involve an evaluation of options against a set of criteria used to assess each option.

- To guide planning and land use management
- To provide specific directions to manage growth
- To give direction on how to achieve sustainability targets and initiatives
- Legislative requirement under the Local Government Act (Sections 471 – 478)

OCP Policy Best Management Practices (Handout)

Key Elements of Good OCP Policy Development

- Easy to read
- Concise
- Unambiguous
- Systematic
- Cross-referenced
- Legally unassailable
- Ambitious but Implementable
- Measureable
- Enforceable within the municipalities resources
