Phase 3 Community Engagement Summary Report General Themes

- Simplify the development process
- Minimize sprawl and respect the growth management boundary
- Collaborate with First Nations, other levels of government, and institutions on issues of mutual interest
- Identify targets and indicators to measure progress









Land Management and Development

- Focus growth in the Core through incentives
- Create walkable neighbourhoods with local-serving commercial
- Encourage more mixed-use development
- Preserve/protect/expand industrial and agricultural land



Economic Development

- Balance Tournament Capital promotion with emphasis on the arts
- Expand evening and weekend business hours in the City Centre







Housing

- Explore the potential to allow secondary suites city-wide
- Encourage a diversity of housing types for all needs and lifestyles
- Address affordability across the entire housing continuum



Transportation & Mobility

- Explore potential for car-free, pedestrian-only streets
- Enhance and promote the active transportation network
- Increase transit service, incentivize transit use, and address parking







Environment

- Encourage alternative energy use and the construction of energy efficient buildings
- Build awareness of and protect grasslands and environmentally sensitive areas (ESAs)



Infrastructure

- Promote household water conservation
- Make infrastructure upgrades where necessary
- Introduce more effective and convenient composting options







Parks and Recreation

- Protect parks and natural areas from development
- Increase the number of interpretive wayfinding features in parks
- Enhance the urban forest by planting more trees



Arts, Culture and Heritage

- Establish an arts district or cultural precinct in the City Centre
- Protect archaeological sites and heritage resources
- Celebrate local First Nations history and heritage







Community Well-being

- Enhance community food security
- Improve inclusion and accessibility in the community
- Partner with other organizations for social planning



Health and Safety


- Create a disaster plan to address community emergencies and crises
- Provide more police foot patrols in City parks
- · Address the ongoing family doctor shortage








Online Survey - Preferred Housing Choice


