### PROPERTY TAXES EXPLAINED

The City recognizes the concern and financial impact that the COVID-19 pandemic has created for some individuals.

Council has announced that the City will delay late payment penalties to give those who are experiencing financial difficulties more time to pay if needed. All property taxes are due July 2, 2020. Penalties for outstanding amounts on residential property (Classes 1, 2, 3, and 9) will be applied on July 31, 2020, and October 1, 2020. Penalties for outstanding amounts on commercial property (Classes 4, 5, 6, 7, and 8) will be applied on October 1, 2020.

Like your household, the City is conscientious of its cash flow. The City relies on property taxes and utility reserves revenues for the majority of its cash flow every year. The timing of receipt from these bills directly impacts the cash flow used to operate our beloved city. We encourage all property owners who can pay their taxes on time to do so. This revenue helps keep the government running and provide vital services that the public relies on, especially in times like these.

### **How Your Property Taxes are Calculated and Used**

#### Thompson-Nicola Regional District, Hospital, and School Taxes

The City collects taxes for external authorities like the TNRD, hospital, and the school district. These external taxes are not set by the City. However, for ease of collection, the City collects the specific amount of taxes along with municipal property taxes in order to disburse the funds on taxpayers' behalf. These taxes are due to these entities by an assigned deadline. Your property taxes are needed to make these payments so that the City does not go into debt.

#### Value of Your Home


Your total property tax amount depends on the assessed value of your home, which is determined by BC Assessment. The City then applies the Council-approved tax rate to a property's assessed value.

#### **City Operations**

The City needs to collect from citizens in order to operate—to balance the necessary costs and priorities while maintaining the service levels that our community expects. Citizens are invited to provide feedback during the budget process. Council approves the budget each spring, and tax rates are subsequently set.

#### **External Factors**

Certain costs are out of the City's control, but they affect property tax rates. Examples include the fluctuating costs of services like insurance and hydro. As a corporate customer of ICBC and BC Hydro, the City, like individuals and families, is faced with covering any rising costs due to rate increases.



#### 2020 PROPERTY TAX DEADLINE AND PENALTIES

Your taxes are due on July 2, 2020. A 5% penalty will be applied to all unpaid residential property tax balances (Classes 1, 2, 3, and 9) on July 31, 2020. Another 5% penalty will be applied to all unpaid residential property tax balances on October 1, 2020.
